A Call To Worship For Reformation Sunday:

The Five Solas of the Reformation: (Five famous phrases that arose during the Reformation of basic statements of essential Christian truths)

L: The Reformation renewed amongst the people scriptural truths. Central amongst them were these: Sola Scriptura: Scripture alone!

P: The Bible alone is our only authority for faith and practice. Scripture is the inspired Word of God, a light to our feet and a lamp to our path.

L: Sola Gratia: Grace alone!

P: Salvation is accomplished through God's grace alone. We are saved not by our own actions, but through God's gracious action in Jesus Christ. Even saving faith is a gift of God's grace.

L: Sola Fide: Faith Alone!

P: We are justified by faith alone. We are not reconciled to God because of our goodness or capabilities; it is by faith; that is, trusting in the Lord Jesus Christ.

L: Solus Christus: Through Christ alone!

P: Jesus is The Way. Jesus is our Savior, none other. Jesus is Lord!

L: Solio Deo Gloria: To God alone be the glory!

P: What is the chief good purpose of all creation? To glorify God! Praise God from whom all blessings flow!

L: May the Holy Spirit reform us with the living knowledge of Christ, May the Spirit reshape us with the love of Christ, May the Holy Spirit resurrect us as the church of Jesus Christ.

Prayer of Confession and Intercession: (Based on the Heidelberg Catechism)

Leader: "What is your only comfort in life and in death?"

People: "That I belong body and soul, in life and in death, not to myself, but to my faithful Savior, Jesus Christ."

Leader: "Why is the Jesus called Savior?"

People: "Because he saves us from our sins, and because salvation is found in no other."

All: Merciful God, we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone. We have not loved you with our whole heart and mind and strength; we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

In your mercy forgive what we have been, help us amend what we are, and direct what we shall be, so that we may delight in your will and walk in your ways for the sake of Jesus Christ. (moments for silent prayer...) Amen.

Unison Assurance of Pardon: (Romans 3:21-27 CEV)

"The Law and the Prophets tell how we become acceptable, and it isn't by obeying the Law of Moses. God treats everyone alike. He accepts people only because they have faith in Jesus Christ. All of us have sinned and fallen short of God's glory. But God treats us much better than we deserve, and because of Christ Jesus, he freely accepts us and sets us free from our sins. God sent Christ to be our sacrifice. Christ offered his life's blood, so that by faith in him we could come to God. And God did this to show that in the past he was right to be patient and forgive sinners. This also shows that God is right when he accepts people who have faith in Jesus. What is left for us to brag about? Not a thing! Is it because we obeyed some law? No! It is because of faith."
