WORSHIP

Traditional Service (8:30 & 11:00 a.m.)

In the Traditional Worship services today with many churches around the world we observe Reformation Sunday. Our music and liturgy seek to lift up this theme. The Reformation is the hallmark period of 500 years ago when the church sought to reform its worship and practice by returning to the sources of scripture, faith in Jesus Christ, and the sovereignty of God. Out of the Reformation movement grew the branches of the Christian faith that today we know as Protestants. The introduction to the Prayer of Confession is taken from the Heidelberg Catechism, a creed of the church written in 1562 during the middle of the Reformation movement. The last hymn is attributed to the great German initiator of the Reformation, Martin Luther. The first hymn to the great teacher of the Reformation, John Calvin. The Introit is based on a tune that we know was sung by the early reformers in worship 500 years ago. Reformation today calls us to reclaim scriptural truth, to heal of old wounds, as together we try to work to build and strengthen the Church and love one another as Christ has loved us.

Connection Service (8:30 & 9:45 a.m.)

In our Connection services this morning, our former Youth Director, Katie White will be speaking. Katie and her family are members of PCPC and Katie will be continuing our study of Spiritual Gifts. She will be focused on the moment of transformation that can happen in a believer's life, one which the earliest followers, the Reformers (whom we celebrate today) and Christ followers through the ages have celebrated and grown with.

Vespers Concert Series (6:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary)

The Vespers Service Sunday evening will be a Reformation Concert at 6:00 p.m. in the Sanctuary. It will feature David Matthews on the Casavant organ, with guest artist Jim Connors on the cello. David presents a musical interpretation of the Protestant Reformation. The program will include Bach Sonata in D for organ and cello, organ interpretation of "A Mighty Fortress" (Luther-Bach), Improvisation on "I Greet Thee Who My Sure Redeemer Art" (Calvin-French Psalter), Carillon De Westminster Vierge, Improvisation on "For All The Saints" by R. V. Williams and Toccata and Fuge in D Minor (J.S. Bach). The program will last one hour.

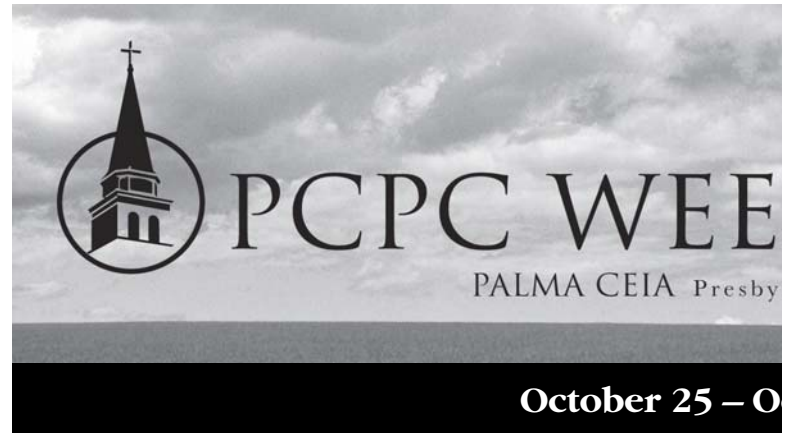

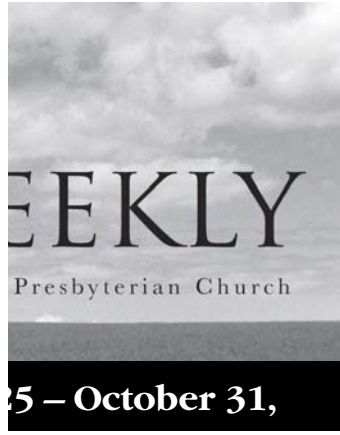
