The History of *The Blood Mobile*

Did you know that for more than 60 years a strong community blood bank has been an active part of the Tampa Bay area? Florida Blood Services believes this amazing feat has been possible because caring community members embrace the value of giving to save a life!

Few blood donors consider themselves heroes. Yet, with each blood donation an individual can save up to three lives. With this gift, a gift that truly comes from within, blood and marrow donors have a remarkable role in being a hero—to a mother who gets to hold her newborn after a difficult delivery, to a neighbor who receives blood units to battle anemia or to a police officer who is fighting cancer—it's all about life!

Palma Ceia Presbyterian Church has a rich history with donating blood in the Tampa Bay area. Florida Blood Services has provided a blood mobile on Sunday mornings since June 1996 so we can give the gift of life. Since then we have donated 1086 pints of blood. The 286 donors from our congregation have had the potential to save 3258 patients in our community. What a wonderful way to give back to our community.

The blood mobile will be parked in front of the church on San Jose Street on Sunday, February 8. Be sure to give the gift of life this month. For more information about Florida Blood Services, please visit their web site at www.fbsblood.org.

PASTORAL MESSAGE

In the famous 13th chapter of the first letter to the Corinthians, a chapter often called “The Love Chapter,” the Apostle ranks love as chief amongst the virtues “The greatest of these is love.” (I Corinthians 13:13) Popularly (especially in February) we think of this as a reference to a feeling shared with intimacy between two people. But a closer look at the chapter in I Corinthians prior to this “Love discourse” will remind us that the Apostle is specifically speaking of gifts that build up the body, the body of Christ. The Church is the body of Christ.

Logically this should be apparent by the prevalence of the marks of love amongst the body, acts of care, support, and relationship within the fellowship, the Body of Christ.

The article on the blood mobile takes a closer look at some of the details about an ongoing ministry that seldom blows its own horn. And yet, is there any greater outward sign of sharing life and love with one another than sharing blood? We all need it. Some of us are able to share it with others. It can't come from anywhere but ourselves. It is a sign of how deeply we are connected, even in the face of differences. It transcends all divisions. It is precious mark of generous love.

The announcement about the Vespers Concert on February 15th is the closest thing we have to a Valentine in the issue. I don't know that it will include Tony Bennett, but David Matthews concert on the music of love seems a great possibility for capping the weekend.

If you have never attended a Wednesday dinner, the article sharing about them might give you the information to push you over the threshold. You'd be welcomed. And a warm home cooked meal has been an outward manifestation of love since bible times. We share one in this family at least once a week.

While the apostle may not have been focusing on marriage when he wrote I Corinthians 13, it certainly has been quoted most often at weddings. And for good reasons. Marriages need to plant, cultivate, and harvest the gift of love. In this issue the Marriage Enrichment article sheds light on a PCPC ministry team that has successfully been nurturing loving marriages for nearly 15 years.

You get a glimpse of loving hands at work in the article about the preschool. Loving like Jesus means welcoming and making room for children. Our preschool is a manifestation of a great love, and it is a great work. This February it is also the place where you are most likely to find the paper hearts.

And at the opposite end of the spectrum The Young At Hearts article reminds us that Jesus said the greatest love could be seen amongst friends. (John 15:13). Sometimes it takes a lifetime of maturing to recognize the value of nurturing friendship within the body. Friendship is a mark of love within the body of Christ.

GIVING TO THOSE IN NEED



The response to Christmas in Africa was outstanding. The total (including Porridge for Papoli) has gone slightly over \$32,000. Emmanuel reports that every household in the Papoli district will receive at least one Christmas gift.

In addition to the outreach our congregation made to Christmas in Africa, we also reached out within our own community. We generated 50 “boxes of hope,” 3 barrels of additional canned food and around \$1,660 in cash and gift cards to Metropolitan Ministries. We gave over 500 gifts to the Giving Tree program and provided transportation for the FED program. Thank you to everyone who participated in making someone else’s Christmas special.

FAITH CAFÉ

College students from Roswell Presbyterian Church in Roswell, GA, visited Tampa over Christmas to perform acts of service. The group, led by Pastor Emily Leffers Wright, who grew up at PCPC, stayed with the Leffers, members of our congregation. They arrived at Faith Café to perform a super clean (cleaned windows, walls, chairs, tables, shelves, refrigerators and the bathrooms). They made sandwiches and served the lunchtime meal. They prayed for our guests and volunteers. Their smiling faces and faith was contagious. It was truly a blessing to have them serve at Faith Café.

Souper Bowl of Caring is a national organization that equips and mobilizes congregations, schools and businesses to positively impact their communities by collecting money or food on or near Super Bowl weekend. 100% of the collections are donated directly to the charity of each group’s choice.

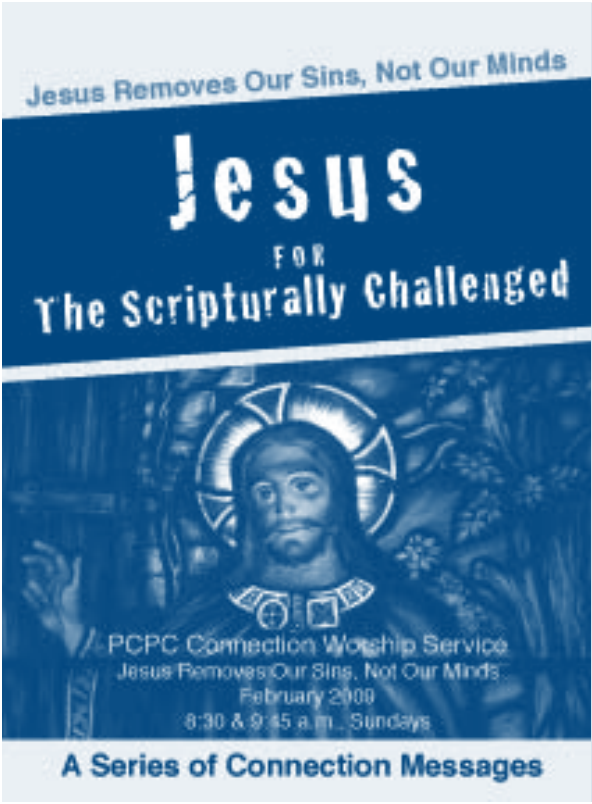

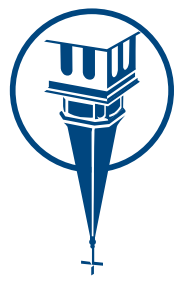
