Giving Thanks

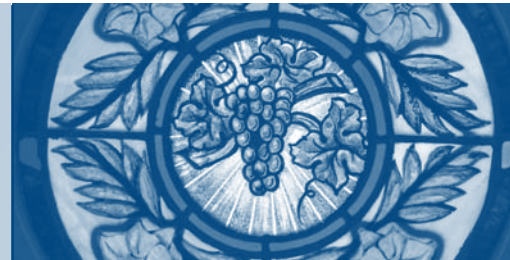

Close to 400 years ago on the rocky and heavily wooded shore of New England a community of faithful believers gave thanks to God. They included their neighbors in that expression primarily because those neighbors helped them survive a torturous year of hardship, frustration and fear. The natives who taught the early Puritans how to survive in this “new” land were received with gratitude because they extended such significant help.

PCPC is in a season of celebration for what God is doing through us as well. In this time we have been able to reach out to our neighbors at North Boulevard Apartments and to women on the streets north of Ybor city. We’ve been able to start a new dormitory building in Uganda and we’ve been able to see a medical team again reach the isolated community of Mombin in Haiti.

What we’ve been able to do is provide others with the means to say thanks. What a significant gift we’ve received by God’s grace – we gave others the chance to say thanks to God. We are part of God’s grace. As we give thanks this season for what we have and enjoy, praise God that our community has come into the lives of those in need and made such a difference.

The Spirit of God called to us, placed in our path those who need our help, and we heard and responded. Praise God through whom all blessings flow and praise him that he saw fit to send some of them through us to others as well.



PASTORAL MESSAGE

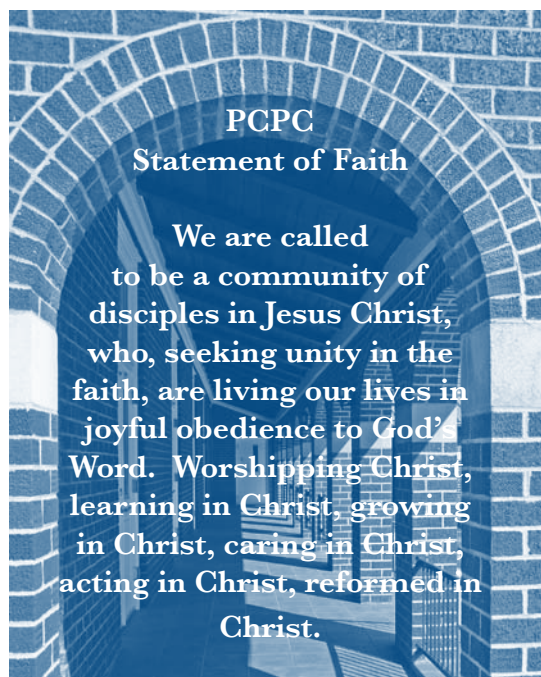

Arcadia Disaster Response

MINISTRY UPDATE

In 2004, Hurricanes Charley, Frances and Jeanne did tremendous damage to the homes and businesses of Arcadia. Initially, our church was working with The First Presbyterian Church of Arcadia to assist them with their ministry to help survivors in the community. Later, most of the churches and non-profit agencies in Arcadia developed the DeSoto Long Term Recovery Center. They recently closed their office but sent an update.

The pickup truck purchased with funds from Palma Ceia Presbyterian Church and First Presbyterian Church of Arcadia was donated to Cedarkirk Camp and Conference Center. All tools and materials (full truck load) were donated to IHOPE, a long term recovery ministry in Immokalee that is supported by Presbyterian Disaster Assistance to respond to needs after Hurricane Wilma.

This ministry has also helped farm workers whose homes were recently damaged by Tropical Storm Fay. A “first response” trailer with tools, etc. is maintained at First Presbyterian Church of Arcadia, and two “depots” for “blue roof” tarps are located in rural DeSoto County. A tarp was delivered to a site where a roof was leaking as the result of Fay’s winds and rain, so even though they are “out of business” they still exist. Volunteers from all over the country replaced 45 homes and repaired almost 500 homes through this ministry.

Rev. Ted Land, pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Arcadia thank the members of Palma Ceia Presbyterian Church for their generosity and the mission teams that drove 200 miles round trips 10 times for over a year to help with their recovery efforts.

The first mission trip for FED was a huge success and we give all the praise to God. “Commit everything you do to the Lord. Trust Him to help you do it, and He will.” God provided the perfect amount of cereal and supplies. We brought 150 boxes of cereal w/scripture verses on each box as well as balls, chalk, bubbles and Play-Doh for the little children. 25 children

gathered for a Bible lesson on God’s creation, and many adults were ministered to as well. As a result of this visit, we had a single mother with six small children join us the next day at church. We want to thank all those who reached out and made this mission possible.

December 1, World AIDS Day, is the day when individuals and organizations from around the world come together to bring attention to the global AIDS epidemic. 2008 marks the 20th anniversary of World AIDS Day.

While we have come a long way since 1988, there is still much to be done. Today HIV is a threat to men, women and children around the world. There are now 33.2 million people living with HIV, including 2.5 million children. During 2007 2.5 million people became newly infected with the virus. Around half of all people who become infected with HIV do so before they are 25 and die before they are 35.

The red ribbon is an international symbol of AIDS awareness worn by people to demonstrate care and concern about HIV and AIDS, and to remind others of the need for their support and commitment.

Please wear a red ribbon on December 1, and ask others to do the same.
