# worship sundays at PCPC

PCPC offers several options for worship. On Sunday mornings, traditional services are held in the Sanctuary at 8:30 am and 11:00 am. At this service we follow the Order for the Lord's Day from the Book of Common Worship and follow the pattern of "Gathering, The Word, and Sending." Hymns are led by the choir and selected from The Presbyterian Hymnal.

In addition, there is a contemporary worship service called The Connection held in the multipurpose room in Covenant Hall at 9:00 am. The service offers a relaxed environment with a message by one of the pastors and music provided by the Praise Band. The sermons typically follow a series format.

A 30-minute Vespers worship service is offered on Sunday evenings at 6:00 pm in the Chapel. This service includes scripture readings, prayer and quiet time for reflection.

The sacraments, baptism and communion, are offered at all three services. There is something for everyone at Palma Ceia Presbyterian Church, and we welcome you to worship with us.

## CHURCH NURSERY

PCPC provides care for infants and toddlers under 3 years of age. The nursery is open on Sunday mornings during all services. Parents electronically check in their child and parents are offered vibrating pagers in case the nursery staff needs to contact them during church. The nursery is located on the 1st floor in the Preschool facility. Our nursery director, Jeanne Rowe, has been on the church staff for over 30 years. ## GODLY PLAY DURING WORSHIP

Children of all ages are welcome in worship. 3-year-olds thru 1st graders can attend Godly Play following "Time with the Children." Godly Play is a Montessori-based program designed to share both the stories from the Bible and the language of worship and seasons of the church year. The Trinity Handbell Choir for adults rehearses on Wednesdays from 6:00-6:50 pm. Junior Handbells, 9-11 year olds, meets Wednesdays 4:00-4:50 pm. Twice a year, PCPC seeks to stock the pantry at Beth-El for an entire month. Donations are based on the current needs of the farmworker families who receive supplemental groceries once a week.

### **Christmas Opportunities to Give (Mid-Nov – Dec 24th)**

**Giving Tree** – Gift tags with specific requests are created for children and families served through FED, Guardian Ad Litem, and Beth-El. Donations ensure the recipients receive a gift at Christmas.

### **Boxes of Hope for Metropolitan Ministries & FED**

Boxes of food are collected to provide a nutritious holiday meal for a family of four who may otherwise be without food during the holiday season.

# mission & ministry without borders

**GLOBAL MISSION PARTNERS** At PCPC, mission is global. We have partnerships with mission projects in Haiti, Uganda, and Honduras, and a relationship in Poland.



## HAITI

*In Haiti, through the non-profit Village Partners International (VPI), for over two decades now we have been partnering with the small community village of Mombin Crochu – one of the poorest*

communities in the Western Hemisphere. Every year, Dr. Sylvia Campbell and Rev. John DeBevoise lead a mission team to work at the hospital and support the operations of the hospital. Recent trips have expanded the work of VPI outside basic patient care to integration with the community on issues of public health/disease and malnutrition prevention. The work being done here is changing lives, and the care within the hospital itself is ongoing.

On several occasions we have also sent mission teams to work in construction of benevolent projects in the fishing village of Montrouis, Haiti through the work of the mission organization "Together We Can", led by Stephen and Autumn Byxbe. Part of their mission is supporting the Agape House Orphanage, a Christ-centered orphanage in Montrouis.



## UGANDA

Connections in Haiti led PCPC and VPI to a relationship with the impoverished village of Papoli, Uganda. In Papoli, PCPC has, with VPI, constructed

a preschool, an elementary school, a library, The Robert H. Cooley Pediatric Clinic (for children with HIV, malnutrition, and malaria), and the Jay and

Janice Jester Maternity and Outpatient Clinic. We have also dug over 8 wells and built homes for widows and orphans. VPI continues currently to focus on Pennies for Papoli (projects allowing school children in the U.S. to help support school children in Papoli) and The Moringa Project. Each day we provide a hot meal of porridge to nearly 1,000 students in the school in Papoli (Porridge for Papoli), and our scholarship program helps students in need (often orphans) to graduate from high school and go on to college. ## HONDURAS

PCPC partners with the Foundation for International Mission to support the New Hope Clinic in Honduras.
